Two things are very unusual this year on All Saints Day. First, All Saints Day is always November 1st; this year, however, it falls on Sunday- a rare occasion. The second remarkable circumstance is that our nation and the world have suffered the loss of hundreds of thousands to a new unique virus called COVID19. This year we have many saints to celebrate, some near to us and some worlds apart from us.

All Saints' is the day in our church year in which we celebrate those who have died. This season is saturated with stories of brave people who have lived lives showing us ways that God's grace has intersected earthly lives. If we have eyes to see – many times we see God's grace in and through deceased loved ones whom we have known.

My favorite hymn for All Saints is Hymn #293, "I sing a song of the saints of God, patient and brave and true...and one was a doctor, and one was a queen, and one was a shepherdess on the green..." The saints of God are those for whom God's love has seeped into the cracks and crevices of the human condition. Let us take these stories as our inspiration and encouragement for the tough task of living this side of heaven.
