Dear Friends,

As I write on Monday, January 18, we do not know what will happen during the Inauguration of President Joe Biden. And so, my words are tempered by that lack of knowing. Even without knowing the future, I know that we are a nation that needs to heal. We are becoming something new and I believe it is Good News.

The lessons for Jan 24<sup>th</sup> help us to engage the <u>newness</u> of our endeavor as Christians and as citizens of the United States. The Lord speaks to Jonah, "Get up, go to Nineveh, that great city, and proclaim to it the message that I tell you." Jonah has to warn his people to change their ways.

In Mark's Gospel John the Baptist has been arrested. Jesus takes over John's ministry and says to the people, "the kingdom of God has come near; repent and believe in the good news." Then Jesus calls the fishermen and asks them to follow him and delve into new depths to find people instead of fish. 'I will make you fishers of people.'

It is a simple message. Follow Jesus and shout out the Good News. Most of us are like Jonah - a bit reluctant to proclaim that our world is about to change. We are reluctant to put on the mantle of messenger. Let us talk about that challenge in our Dialogue Sermon.

This week we focus on what it means today to follow God's call to proclaim good news. We pray for the courage, inspiration, and confidence we need to be what we are called to be.

Courage, inspiration, and confidence comes when we rest in the assurance that God will get us through and trust in the Lord, as the Psalmist says:

For God alone my soul in silence waits; \* truly, my hope is in him.
He alone is my rock and my salvation, \* my stronghold, so that I shall not be shaken.
