Dear Friends,

We read in Mark's gospel this week that Jesus is accused of casting out demons with demons. Jesus responds wisely, how can Satan cast out Satan? Then we hear the familiar phrase that a divided kingdom cannot stand. At this time, our own nation is divided as severely as it has ever experienced. We might think that our President can resolve our differences. We certainly hope that will happen.

The message from the Lord gives to Samuel is to let the people decide whether they want a king or not. Give them the choice to make for themselves. The people said, "Give us a king to govern us." The Lord tells Samuel, "Listen to the voice of the people…they have not rejected you, but they have rejected me from being king over them." What these passages all have in common is the question of leadership – the who and the what – of leadership. In the end, Jesus said, "Whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother."

I hope that we can talk this week about the divisions that have divided our nation and how we, as citizens and Christians, can claim allegiance to God. At the founding of the United States, the idea of a king was rejected. Democracy was borne of a desire to share power and wealth – the 'commonwealth'. Each time we have strayed from those founding principles, we must struggle to find a better way. As individuals we are guided by our faith and our convictions. God asks us to put those; our faith and our convictions, to the test of the Holy Spirit and the will of God.
