That is my answer to all of you and to those who asked. I value and respect all those who are like me or different. I value and respect those whose choices in life are like mine and are not. I defend the right of a woman to choose what is right for her. I defend the safety and health of a child abused and I defend the right of those so very different from me to be who they are, to be who God made them to be.

I do believe the Supreme Court, in the majority's haste to make history and turn back almost 50 years of precedence, has left all women and babies at greater risk than ever before. I will leave it at that.

I hope to see you this Sunday July 10 at the 10 am service. Thank you.
