Jon in his first Easter Sunday as our official Priest-In-Charge and was exquisitely enhanced by beautiful music. We were blessed this year with beautiful weather so the children, youth (and some adults) enjoyed the Easter Egg hunt outside in the church yard. Also following the service in our festively decorated hall, our parish friends shared their Easter joy through the "Lift Ev'ry Gift" event where they treated us to their many talents: from piano and violin, to recitation of prose, interpretive dance, interactive prose and music, solo and multi-part choral singing. We have a lot to celebrate at Emmanuel as we enter the 50-day Easter season.

Among the many wonderful reasons to celebrate being a member of the Episcopal Church is our democratic governance by both clergy and laity. Ed and Frank Fleming are Emmanuel's elected Diocesan Delegates who will be representing us in voting for our 17th Bishop at the Special Diocesan Convention Saturday May 18, 2024. While actual votes are cast only by the delegates, each of us is invited (and encouraged) to become involved and to learn more. *Then, let either Frank, Ed, Fr. Jon or your wardens know what you think.*

Upcoming dates open to each of us prior to the election are:

Monday, April 8 - Deadline for any of us to submit our questions to the candidates. The Transition Committee will select submitted questions to be posed to each candidate at the Meet & Greet sessions by scanning the QR code:



April 8 is also the deadline for anyone interested in serving as a Meet & Greet moderator to apply. More information is available on the Diocesan website under Bishop Search website.

- 1) Who is Jesus to you?
- 2) What calls you to discern being a Bishop? Why now? Why with the Diocese of Massachusetts?
- 3) When was a time you faced a challenge or opportunity that called forth your gifts as a strategic leader? Tell us this story.
- 4) The Diocese of Massachusetts works against sexism, racism, and homophobia, and toward diversity, equity, inclusion, and belonging. Can you describe an experience articulating the social, economic, and political dimensions of the Gospel? In that experience, how did you engage with people with differing views?
- 5) Please share an experience serving in a multicultural and/or multilingual context.

What do you think is important to you and to Emmanuel for our next Bishop? Some interesting informal conversations around the fellowship tables are sure to come!
