## **Emmanuel Vestry & Neponset River Deanery News**

- Property work updates:
  - Steeple shingles have been repaired.
  - The outside lights which illuminate our sign have been replaced.
  - Multiple basement repair estimates after post-flood demolition have been requested and we are reviewing them as they come in. For everyone's safety, please do not go down to the basement level until further notice.
- Church of the Epiphany, Walpole hosted our November 12<sup>th</sup> Neponset River Deanery meeting and guest speaker the Rev. Marisa Rohrbach. Canon Rohrbach spoke with attendees about the Diocesan Core Values, Mission and Priorities. She gave a brief overview of the role of the Canon and shared that Bishop Julia values building relationships and collaboration. She also wants the Diocese to provide more support to parishes as we've requested and the Diocesan budget will reflect that goal by increasing staff. We also heard from a St. John's parishioner about his passion for an organization called the Leonard Education Organization (LEO), [Home - Leonard Education Organization](#). He told us a bit about their mission: "to empower young under-resourced Palestinian students from the West Bank, Gaza, Lebanon, Jordan and beyond to overcome challenges to pursue higher education.....to become future leaders in fields like science, education, policy, and entrepreneurship." He stressed that it is not a political organization. The next Deanery meeting will be March 4<sup>th</sup>, 2026.
